

# Arthur's Adventure

#### or Merlin to the Rescue

# A pantomime by Peter Webster

Mrs Tickleme, housekeeper to the Knight Sir Jikal-Trusse, sets the scene. The King is dead and a successor must be found. The Knights of the Round Table suggest various ways to settle the succession, but are eventually persuaded by Merlin the magician, to hold a tournament to decide who will try to pull the legendary sword from the stone, with whoever succeeds becoming King. Sir Jikal-Trusses's son, Sir Loin, briefs Arthur his squire, as to all the equipment he needs for the tournament and sends Arthur to fetch it, with the final instruction not to forget a thing. Of course, Arthur forgets something crucial - Sir Loin's sword; seeing one seemingly abandoned, he takes it and brings it to Sir Loin, who realising it is not his, asks Arthur where he found it

When Sir Loin realises the significance of this, he takes the sword and sends Arthur away into the forest, so as to keep the secret to himself, much to the disgust of Mrs Tickleme and Margaret, his beloved.

All this is witnessed by **Morgan**, an enchantress, and her son **Robin**: Morgan plans to put Robin on the throne and decides to eliminate Arthur by sending Robin and her Dark Knights to capture him and throw him into the deepest dungeon.

Will Arthur find a way to evade her clutches and take his rightful place on the throne? Will Sir Loin live to regret his actions? How will Arthur and his friends find a way to defeat Morgan and ensure that all ends happily? Watch and you'll find out!

There will be an interval of twenty minutes between acts, when refreshments will be available and (at evening performances) the raffle will be drawn.

#### Emma Butcher (Arthur)

Emma has been flautist in the panto orchestra for the last two years, and this is her first move from the "orchestra pit" to centre stage. At FCC she was a "pink lady" in their production of **Grease** and hopes to study drama at university next year.





#### Bex Hutchings (Mrs Tickleme)

We are very pleased to welcome Bex to the stage in Faringdon for the third time. Her debut role was memorable "ugly sister" Petronella in last year's panto **Happily Ever After**, and you may have seen her in **Side Effects** at Buscot Park Theatre. She's really enjoying being a traditional pantomime dame!

#### Josh Dunn (Sir Loin)

Josh's first time on stage was here at the Junior School, in their production of **Joseph and the Amazing Technicolour Dreamcoat** (he was Pharaoh's assistant). Since then he has been more of a musician than an actor, playing guitar and bass, but he's really enjoying this, his first panto with FDS.





# Lottie Allum (Margaret)

As well as being a panto regular, Lottie has appeared in FCC's production of **Annie**, and was a fairy in **A Midsummer Night's Dream**. Dance is one of her great loves and she very much enjoyed working on the choreography in **The Scarlet Pumpernickel** three years ago.

#### Suzanna Carter (Morgan Le Fay)

This is Suzanna's third appearance with FDS. Previously she has played Prince Charming (in **Cinderella**, 2012) and Jack (of **The Beanstalk**) in 2013. Suzanna has had a few years away whilst starting a family but she is delighted to be back. "I'm pleased to be playing a villain which is a new departure for me and I look forward to the shows"!





#### Dom Allum (Robin)

Dom has been in many FDS pantos and you may remember him as Sneak (or was it Squeak?) the mouse in last year's **Happily Ever After**. He's pleased to return to human form again and to play the role of Robin.



#### Sarah Couzens (Merlin)

Her first panto with FDS, Sarah's most recent appearances have been in Living Together (2015), The Odd Couple and London Suite (both in 2011). When she first joined FDS in 2001 Sarah took on the title role in Daisy Pulls it Off (where she gave "a very convincing performance") and also appeared in Arsenic and Old Lace (2004).

## Gary Field (Sir Jikal-Trusse)

Gary joined FDS in February 2005 and although he first worked backstage it wasn't long before he stepped into the spotlight. He has been in numerous plays and taken several roles in panto (once as Bo Peep!). Gary directed **I Thought I heard a Rustling** (2009) and **Wife After Death** (2013), and is the current chairman of FDS.





#### **Helen Thrower** (Sir Plusse)

Helen joined FDS for **Jack and the Beanstalk** in 2013, and has been in several plays since. She has plenty of experience in drama, both at the Pegasus Theatre and in schools. At the Unicorn in Abingdon she has directed **Robin Hood, Oliver Twist** and **Cats**, and with FDS **The Scarlet Pumpernickel** and **Happily Ever After** (which she co-wrote with Verity).

## Verity Roberts (Sir Cuitous)

Verity has taken leading roles in **The Importance of Being Earnest**, **Cold Comfort Farm**, and **The Odd Couple**, and was Hermia in 2013's **A Midsummer Night's Dream**. She has had significant parts in no fewer than seven of our last nine pantos. Verity was co-author (with Helen Thrower) of last year's panto **Happily Ever After**.





#### Sandra Keen (Sir Reale)

Sandra has been acting for sixteen years, starting with a production of **Cinderella**, and has since performed a wide range of rôles including Lady Sneerwell in Sheridan's **School for Scandal**. At FDS we last saw Sandra on stage in **Wife After Death** (2013) and **Living Together** (2015).

#### **Debbie Lock** (Sir Veillance)

Debbie has been with FDS for over twenty years – she has appeared in a variety of productions and has directed several plays and pantomimes, most recently **Side Effects** at Buscot Park last year. She was last on stage in **Agatha Crusty** in November and you may have spotted her "mirror image" in the last panto **Happily Ever After**.



# **Faringdon Dramatic Society**

Faringdon Dramatic Society was formed over sixty years ago in 1948. Since then it has mounted around 150 productions, ranging from pantomime to dramas, comedies and Shakespeare. Recently we have carried off a number of awards including the NODA Flame Award for **Heroes** in 2010: 'for inspirational contribution to the pursuit of excellence in Theatre'
