Our Cast

Willow Tate (Mary)

Willow, 15, already has twelve years of performing arts training and stage experience with companies including FDS (Dick Whittington, Wishing on a Star), Tanwood (Cats, 42nd Street), A Fusion of Arts, Tring CBA and Swindon CAT. This year she appeared in professional panto, Beauty & the Beast, at the Wyvern.



Lu Waywell (Queenie)

This time last year Lu returned to FDS to play pregnant, unmarried Milly Carter in Alan Ayckbourn's **Gosforth's Fete** here at Buscot. But in case you think she's in danger of being typecast, you may also have seen her in **Sleeping Beauty**, this year's panto, as (male) Billy, the silly singing butler.

Jade Atkinson (Dolores)

Jade has been performing since she was four. She joined FDS in January as Spindleshanks the "bad fairy's cat" in **Sleeping Beauty**. But she is a veteran of Stagecoach Performing Arts in Faringdon where among other roles she has been **Shrek**, Sandy in **Grease**, and **Captain Daniels** (aka Jack Sparrow).

Heather Kent (Norma)

Heather lives in Fairford and also comes to us from the Stagecoach Performing Arts. This year she was Fairy Beautiful in the FDS panto **Sleeping Beauty**, but her favourite role so far has been Miss Trunchbull in **Matilda** last year. This is her first role in an "adult" play and she's really enjoying it.

Carolyn Taylor (Matron)

Carolyn has directed and appeared in so many FDS productions since 1986 there's no space here to list them all. As well as writing one of our pantos, she's also been in a lot of open air Shakespeare, and most recently played Polonius in the BMH Production of **Hamlet** at Oxford Castle.





Helen Tate (Mrs Adams)

Nell has been a member of FDS since 2013, both on stage and behind scenes in the costume team. As a child, she danced in panto at the Wyvern Theatre and in **Nutcracker** with Northern Ballet at Bath Theatre Royal. She's looking forward to sharing the stage with her real daughter, Willow.
