The Genie rap song and dance was fun but in a cast of 45 plus 13 children it is probably unfair to single out anyone.

Brilliant lighting (turning green trees to purple, so effective) Wardrobe terrific with great attention to detail. Make-up excellent - ethereal fairies and great rats, sinister shiny wolf. 5 piece orchestra, sympathetically led by Debra Warner. Good use of front-cloth and centre aisle - although I did feel the pace dropped occasionally - but again a very entertaining pantomime from FDS
