Profiles of some of the Principal characters

Ellie Hickman (Cinderella)

Ellie's first principal role was Long John Silver in St John's School Carterton's **Treasure Island**. A talented dancer who has performed in a number of shows locally, we have recently seen Ellie in **Jack and the Beanstalk, The Scarlet Pumpernickel, The Snow Queen** (also as Cinderella!) and as one of Titania's fairies in **A Midsummer Night's Dream.** Ellie hopes eventually to act professionally.





Bex Hutchings (Petronella)

We are very pleased to welcome Bex to the stage in Faringdon. You wouldn't know it but the last time she trod the boards was ten years ago when she took the title role in **Snow White**. "But she was a BAD Snow White" says Bex, "and although I've thoroughly enjoyed being an Ugly Sister I do hope I'm not going to be go-to girl for all the nasty parts!"

Andrea Smith (Citronella)

Andrea is a Dance and PE teacher, and she has appeared in several pantos over the past few years – she was the heroine Gloria in **The Snow Queen**, Florence in **Jack and the Beanstalk** and before that she took the title role in **Aladdin**. In the past Andrea has taken on other principal roles such as Cinderella and the Sugar Plum Fairy and her performance highlight to date was representing her county in the Millennium Dome in 2000.





Jeni Summerfield (Wicked Witch)

Jeni has been with FDS for 25 years this year and has now completed the set of Queen, Fairy and Witch in various pantos, not to mention a nasty stepmother – Hysteria in **Cinderella** (2013). She has appeared in many other productions including **The Crucible** and **Dancing at Lughnasa**. She has also directed some one act plays but most of the time is to be found feverishly designing and sewing costumes.

Carolyn Taylor (Fairy Godmother)

Considering how active Carolyn has been in FDS, she has appeared on stage in very few pantos in recent years. Carolyn has however directed several and written one (**Beauty and the Beast** in 2009). She has been involved in many other productions, most recently **A Midsummer Night's Dream** (as director) and **Wife After Death** in 2013.





Duncan Sinclair (Dame Trott)

This is Duncan's fourth appearance in a Faringdon panto, having taken various roles in Wantage and Cirencester over the years. You may remember him as ugly sister Hernia in **Cinderella**, the Ogre in **Jack and the Beanstalk** and Gaston Legroom in the **Scarlet Pumpernickel** two years ago. Last year Duncan played Charlie Chalk ("yet another not-too-bright character") in Aldbourne's panto **Robin Hood**.

Katie Dyet (Evil Queen)

Katie has appeared many times in panto, including as the back end of a horse in **Jack and the Beanstalk**, and most recently as Jack Frost in last year's **The Snow Queen**. Katie has taken many roles in plays as well, such as **Candleford** (where she won critical acclaim but didn't utter a word!), **The Odd Couple, London Suite** and **Wife After Death**. Katie is currently chair of FDS and has taken numerous roles behind the scenes.





Helen Thrower (Director)

You may have seen Helen twice last year, in **The Snow Queen** and **Living Together**. She has plenty of experience in drama, both at the Pegasus Theatre in Oxford and in schools where she has taught. At the Unicorn in Abingdon she has directed productions including **Robin Hood, Oliver Twist** and **Cats**, and with FDS **The Scarlet Pumpernickel** two years ago. This, however is the first panto she has co-written as well as directed and she's loving seeing her "baby" come to fruition.
