The Principal Characters

Amanda Linstead (The Snow Queen)

Amanda's first production with FDS was in **Daisy Pulls it Off**, followed by **Brush Up Your Shakespeare**, **Cabaret** (as Sally Bowles) and **Candleford** (as Dorcas Lane). We have seen her on stage recently in **The Odd Couple**, **Present Laughter**, **Wife After Death** and **Steel Magnolias**. This is her first role in a panto however, and she is very much enjoying being a "baddie"!



Seb Allum (Carlo)

Seb has now been in eight FDS pantos, most recently as Alphie in **The Scarlet Pumpernickel** last year, but this is his first one as "leading man"! Seb took two roles in last November's **Reflections** (a corporal and a second lieutenant) and has also performed for the Wantage Stage Musical Company, where he played Peter in **The Railway Children**. His dream is to become a professional actor and perform on a West End Stage. He hopes you enjoy the show!

Andrea Smith (Gloria)

Andrea is a Dance and PE teacher, and we are pleased to welcome her back to FDS after two years – her last part was Florence in **Jack and the Beanstalk** and before that she took the title role in **Aladdin**. In the past Andrea has taken on other principal roles such as **Cinderella** and the **Sugar Plum Fairy** and her performance highlight to date was being chosen to represent her county in the Millennium Dome in 2000.





Katie Dyet (Jackie)

Katie has appeared many times in panto, most recently as half of the horse Magnesia in **Jack and the Beanstalk** (2013), but has taken many roles in plays as well. In one role she didn't say a word, yet received critical acclaim – as the mute Loony Joe in **Candleford** - and was most recently in **The Odd Couple, London Suite** and **Wife After Death.** Katie is currently chair of FDS and has often worked behind the scenes.

Verity Roberts (Jill)

Verity has taken leading roles in **The Importance of Being Earnest**, **Cold Comfort Farm**, and **The Odd Couple**, and was Hermia in 2013's **A Midsummer Night's Dream**. She has now had significant parts in no fewer than six of our last eight pantos, most recently as the Dame (Mimi) in last year's **Scarlet Pumpernickel** – traditionally a male role but Verity made it her own. This year she is back on familiar ground as one of a comedy duo!





Helen joined FDS for Jack and the Beanstalk in 2013, and she then took the role of Hippolyta in A Midsummer Night's Dream, Truvy in Steel Magnolias and Madge in last November's Reflections. She has plenty of experience in drama, both at the Pegasus Theatre in Oxford and in schools where she has taught. At the Unicorn in Abingdon she has directed productions including Robin Hood, Oliver Twist and Cats, and last year's Scarlet Pumpernickel.

Yvonne Kelly (The Sun Queen / Eleanor)

A relative newcomer to FDS, this is Yvonne's third stage appearance with us – she was the mysterious Simone de Boudoir in **The Scarlet Pumpernickel** last year, and Shelby in **Steel Magnolias**. Yvonne studied for a degree in Drama and Journalism in 2008 and now runs a soft play and party package hire company, as well as bringing up a family, so we hope she can find time for future productions!



Peter Webster (Author & Director)

Although he is seen on stage from time to time, Peter is more likely to be found with a paintbrush or screwdriver behind the scenes. Or with a penhe is a prolific author of pantomimes, including **The Snow Queen** and **Jack and the Beanstalk** which he directed two years ago. His last stage appearances were as the Baron in **Cinderella** (which he also wrote) and as Mr McGregor in **Reflections** last year.
